What is AIDA?

AIDA is an Erasmus+ (KA2) project designed to target elderly people with intellectual disabilities.

People from this group often lack the same quality of life as other people of the same age. The main focus of the project is to improve the quality of VET courses for teaching staff and field professionals, giving them the opportunity to be trained in the framework of care for elderly people with intellectual disabilities, so that the knowledge they acquire can then be transferred to their students.



What will be produced

- Identification of the needs and characteristics of elderly people with ID, through the creation of a map which will indicate the specific bio-psycho-social needs and main characteristics of elderly people with intellectual disabilities, and the technical skills which professionals working in the field need to acquire.
- Curriculum for VET courses, aiming to cover the training needs of VET teachers and professionals working with elderly people with intellectual disabilities.
- An Online Training Course, which will enable a large number of people (VET teachers and professionals) to be trained on how to work with elderly people with intellectual disabilities.

Expected impact

- Greater understanding and responsiveness in the care of elderly people with intellectual difficulties
- Promotion of active participation in society of the elderly with intellectual difficulties
- Further reduction of social inequality
- Promotion of social inclusion and non-discrimination
- Raising awareness in society about elderly people with intellectual disabilities, their specific needs, and the care they need to improve their quality of life
